Storage of Work

Paint Clean-up

Water-based paint: wipe off paint from brushes with a paper towel or rag and then clean brush with water in a container. Do not clean your brushes directly in the sink.

Oils: Only odorless mineral spirits (OMS) may be used. Rags must be dried and disposed of in galvanized metal buckets.

Scents

Please do not wear strong scents or perfume in consideration of students and faculty who have sensitivities.

Classroom

- For courses that make use of easels, students may be asked to help with the putting up and taking down of their easels and the setting up of their work stations.
- We ask that students staying in the classroom during lunch use the library area while the room is cleaned between classes.

ONLINE COURSES

- Online classes are delivered in real-time using Zoom. Instructors email the meeting link prior to the first class. You may join the meeting 5-10 minutes before the start of class; we encourage use of video. Please keep your mic muted unless speaking to reduce background noise.
- Online courses have a Dropbox folder for submitting homework. Do not delete any images from Dropbox unless you are deleting your own image to replace it with another. This is a shared platform, so images would be deleted for everyone including the instructor.

PHOTOCOPYING & PRINTING

Photocopying and printing services are available in the office for \$0.25 per page of black and white, and \$0.50 per page of colour printing.

Please note: VISA cannot accommodate a large volume of printing. For more than 5 pages we recommend Monk Office.

PROMOTION

Office staff will occasionally take photographs of the classroom and student artwork for promotional purposes. If you do not wish for your face or artwork to be shown in our social media or website, please inform the office.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

Workload and Expectations: Students are expected and required to devote additional studio and research time to class projects. An average of three hours of homework per three-hour course can be expected.

Attendance and Lateness

- Program students: no more than three classes can be missed in a course or you risk a failing grade. Inform the office and instructor if you will be absent.
- Program students attending online courses must have video on in order to be considered present for the class.
- Please arrive to class five minutes early. Late arrivals are disruptive to the instructor and fellow students. If late more than twice, each subsequent late arrival will be considered as ½ class absence (i.e. two lates = one absence). Inform your instructor if you anticipate being late.
- The building is locked at 6:30pm. If you anticipate being late for an evening class, you may wish to exchange phone numbers with another student who can let you in.

Exam Makeup Fee

If you are unable to attend a scheduled exam there will be a \$25 fee for writing at a different time.

Assessment and Grading

Only students enrolled in the *Certificate of Visual Arts* program receive grades and only 12-week courses are graded (six-week courses and workshops do not qualify towards the Certificate). Final grades are emailed 2-3 weeks after the semester ends. Non-program students who have been graded up until this point will receive credit for these courses if they enrol in the Certificate Program within four years (2025). Refund Policy

Withdrawal (written notice) 7 or more days before start of course	5%
Withdrawal (written notice) less than 7 days before start of course	10%
Withdrawal (written notice) after first class	15%
Withdrawal (written notice) after second class	20%
Withdrawal (written notice) after third class	50%
No refund after fourth class	

Workshop Refund	Admin Fee
Withdrawal 7 days (written notice) before start of workshop	10%
Withdrawal less than 7 days (written notice) before start of workshop	15%
Withdrawal less than 48 hours before start of workshop	35%
No refund if withdrawal is less than 12 hours before start of workshop
